  3. Entrant must be the Bona – fide property of the exhibitor
  4. In case of dispute or question of eligibility the Chief steward's decision is final
  5. Any departure from the schedule shall be at the request of the judges and can only be adopted with unanimous approval of the exhibitors and the stewards
  6. Order of judging will be as by the schedule. Sheep are to remain on exhibition until 4pm unless permission is gained from the steward to remove them.
  7. The judge may withhold any award if he considers exhibits unworthy
  8. All exhibitors to be on the grounds by 9am for judging at 10.00am
  9. The age of all classes to be the actual age at day of show.
  10. The provision of fodder is the responsibility of the exhibitor.

# NATIONAL SHEEP HEALTH DECLARATION - EXPLANATORY NOTES

## Overview

Completing this National Sheep Health Declaration (NSHD) will assist prospective buyers to make an informed decision about the health status and management history of these sheep. The NSHD is mandatory for all sheep movements in SA and for sheep being moved into NSW and Tasmania. It is voluntary in other states.

## Livestock Production Assurance (1)

Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) program accreditation means that a property must have a biosecurity plan for the property. [The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual for Grazing Livestock Production](#) can be used to develop plans or further information including templates is available at: [www.farmbiosecurity.com.au/extension/aha-livestock-extension/property-biosecurity](http://www.farmbiosecurity.com.au/extension/aha-livestock-extension/property-biosecurity)

## Footrot (3 and 4)

Scald and footrot cause a spectrum of disease to sheep feet especially in wet, warm environments. Scald (or ovine interdigital dermatitis) is usually mild inflammation between the hooves. Footrot is an infection caused by the bacterium *Dichelobacter nodosus*, which breaks down the tissue between the horn and the foot and can result in painful separation or 'underrun' of the sole especially with the more virulent form.

Virulent footrot is defined differently in each state. For information on this and interstate movements of sheep, producers should visit the relevant state department website or contact animal health staff from that department.

4. If answered Yes, all mobs should have been inspected during the last spread period, and any lameness investigated, with no signs of the disease observed. If answered no, producers should include any information about the disease and their management of it; e.g. whether any testing has been carried out, or what treatments may have been used recently.

## Lice (5)

All mobs should be checked for lice at least twice each year. Any sheep seen with rubbed fleece or pulled wool should be checked for lice as a matter of urgency. Further information is available at: [www.paraboss.com.au](http://www.paraboss.com.au)

## Approved Vaccinate (7)

A sheep that is identified by an NLIS (sheep) 'V' tag and is:

- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine by 16 weeks of age, OR

- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine after 16 weeks of age, when the flock:
  - was in the SheepMAP, or
  - had undertaken a negative Faecal 350 test in the two (2) years preceding the vaccination, or
  - had a Negative Abattoir 500 status at the time of vaccination.

## SheepMAP (8)

An audited quality assurance program incorporating a property biosecurity plan, animal health risk assessment, testing, and movement controls that provide a source of low risk animals. Note - the level of testing varies depending on the status. Date of last test should be recorded in Q9.

## Types of tests that may be recorded (9)

**Faecal 350:** A test of 350 representative sheep over 2 years of age (or all sheep over 2 years of age in smaller flocks) by Pooled Faecal Culture (PFC) or High Throughput Johne's (HT-J) PCR in pools of up to 50 sheep. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

**Abattoir 500 (or 150):** At least 500 (or 150) sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 24 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for JD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

## Other relevant health information (10)

Any other information that the consigner thinks may be relevant can be recorded here; e.g. any other management practices carried out for JD, participation in an active grower group, One Biosecurity, or other biosecurity initiatives, mulesing status, pain relief usage, etc.

## Declaration

Signing this declaration has legal significance under fair trading and other relevant state legislation. Regulatory authorities may also take legal action, and purchasers may seek damages for any information that is incorrect. Before signing you must be satisfied you understand all elements of the document, and these explanatory notes.

# Producer Checklist

Thank you for your commitment to our show! Accurate livestock traceability helps **Protect our Production** against disease, maintains exports, and improves our international reputation.

## **Know your Property Identification Code**

- You need a Property Identification Code to enter livestock into a show.

## **Complete Entry Forms**

- Fill out the relevant show entry form and Agricultural Shows NSW Waiver.
- Ensure you have the results of any necessary tests and completed vaccinations if required.
- Ask your Show Secretary for the showground Property Identification Code. Yes, shows have one too.

## **Check livestock for National Livestock Identification System Devices**

- Ensure all livestock have an approved National Livestock Identification System device, ear tag, or swine brand.
- Replace any damaged or lost devices.
- Order new devices or ear tags and an approved applicator if needed.

## **Prepare Movement Records by either**

- Completing Livestock Production Assurance Accreditation and ordering a National Vendor Declaration book **OR**
- Completing Livestock Production Assurance Accreditation and get access to electronic National Vendor Declaration online or use the Electronic National Vendor Declaration application **OR**
- Get a Transported Stock Statement for both the forward and return journeys.

## **Complete Animal Health Declaration**

- Ensure livestock have the relevant Animal Health Declaration.

## **Submit Paperwork**

- Present all required paperwork, including your movement documents, to the steward responsible before unloading livestock.

## **Follow Show Requirements**

- Comply with all timings and requirements for bump-in, unloading, and exhibiting.

## **End of the show**

- Ensure you have a movement document when transporting your animals.
- Your Show society will update the NLIS database with a sighted livestock record list, helping ensure the integrity of our agricultural industry.
